CovidSafety
Masks must be worn indoors and outdoors except if at home or if an exception applies AND must be carried at all times

With numerous exposure sites around Melbourne, the Hallam PS community is reminded to remain vigilant in relation to the highly infectious Delta variant.

CovidSafety behaviours include:

- wearing a mask
- QR check-in everywhere you visit, no matter how long you spend at that location.
- maintaining 1.5 metres from others
- getting vaccinated when you're eligible

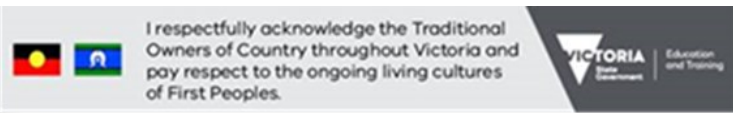
If you have any symptoms, no matter how mild, you must get tested for COVID-19. Symptoms include:

- fever / chills or sweats / cough / sore throat / shortness of breath / runny nose / loss or change in sense of smell or taste
- some people may also experience headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.

If your child has any symptoms they must not come to school. You should make an appointment with your medical practitioner, who may require your child to have a Covid test. You will need to provide a negative Covid test result and/or a medical certificate when you child is well enough to return to school.

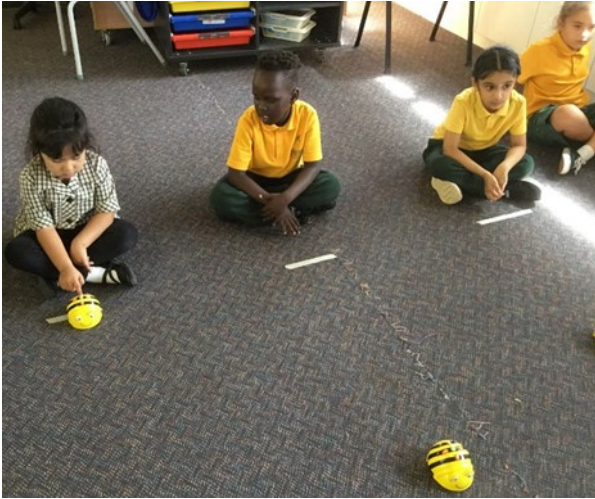


This public health poster, illustrated by May Gibbs, was part of a government campaign in NSW to limit the spread of the deadly spanish flu epidemic in 1918–1919.

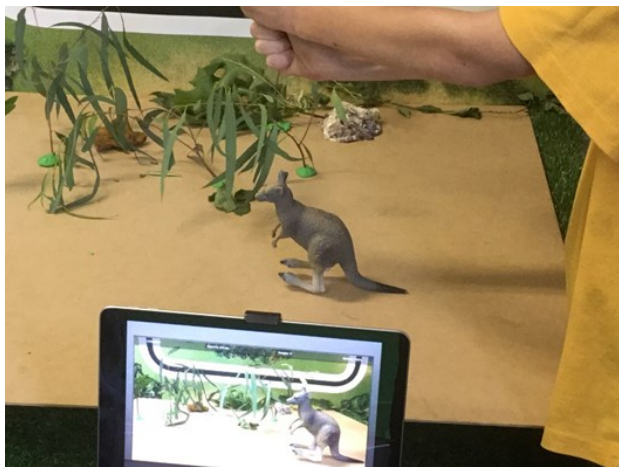
Science and Technology activities in the STEM Centre -Term 1
