At the close of nominations I had received two Parent Member category nominations and one School Employee category nomination. Preps Attend Full Time-Monday 4 March

Following a successful transition into Prep during February, Prep students are now expected to be at school every day from Monday 4 March, unless they are not well enough to attend. Prep students generally are now able to come into the school and independently go to their class line up areas, follow teachers' instructions and class routines, participate in the learning and teaching sessions and play with their peers.

Uniform

The School Council, in line with Department of Education policy, sets the school uniform requirements for Hallam PS students. It is the role of the staff to implement the policy.

Since the start of the 2024 school year, we have noticed that many students are not wearing the School Council-approved dress code. Initially, staff provided reminders about the dress code to students, however, Uniform Infringements are now being given to students with an expectation that they will wear the approved school uniform.

Parents and students are reminded that school shoes/ sneakers should be dark in colour; preferably black. Uniform colours are bottle green and gold, so differently coloured long-sleeved shirts, obvious underneath short-sleeved polos, are not acceptable. Glittery headwear is also not approved. Please ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform.

Breakfast Club

At the end of February, Breakfast Club has provided breakfast to 902 participants. Thank you to the Wellbeing Team coordinating this service, especially Mrs Charlotte Cox who coordinates Breakfast Club each day, teachers who are rostered on to supervise and assist and our student Breakfast Club assistants

Hallam PS is also grateful for the support of Food Bank which provides most of the supplies for Breakfast Club, and to School Council for making the school hall available and providing essential equipment.

A reminder that Breakfast Club opens at 8:30am for all students who might need some breakfast, may want something additional to eat although they have already had breakfast or may just want to catch up with friends over some milk and toast.

GET ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHER PROGRAM ROUND 7 IS NOW OPEN.

GET ACTIVE KIDS IS excited to announce that **Round 7 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program** is now open!

In this round, applications for a voucher or a reimbursement will close when the allocation has been exhausted. Vouchers expire 30 April 2024 so members of your community can use their voucher for a summer sport, winter sport or term-based activity.

IMPORTANT DATES

Round 7 opens for applications for a voucher or reimbursement: 10:00 am Tuesday 10 October 2023 until allocation exhausted

Reimbursement expenditure dates: from 8 May 2023 until allocation is exhausted

Vouchers expiry date: Tuesday 30 April 2024

Portal open for Activity Providers to redeem vouchers: Tuesday 10 October 2023 to Tuesday 21 May 2024.

Eligible families can apply for \$200 vouchers and use them at a registered Get Active Kids Voucher Activity Provider without having to worry about upfront costs.

The vouchers can help pay for sporting equipment, uniforms and memberships in a range of activities from club cricket to dance. There's also an opportunity to enrol toddlers in a range of activities including important learn to swim classes.

To be eligible, kids need to be aged 0 to 18 years, a Victorian resident, named on a valid Commonwealth Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card and on a valid Medicare Card at the time of application.

A special consideration stream is also available to support children residing in Victorian Care Services, temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants and international students up to 18 years at the time of application.
