Hallam PS 2025 Prep Enrolments

To be eligible for Prep at Hallam PS in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

What you need to do:

- Use Find My School to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to as your local school).
- Contact Hallam PS to book a school tour or to learn more about the school and the enrolment application process.
- Request an Application/Enrolment form from the school.
- Submit your Application/Enrolment for Foundation (Prep) as soon as possible before Term 4.
- Take part in information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
- NOTE: Students will start Foundation (Prep) at Hallam PS on Thursday 30 January 2025.









Great Stories Inspire Change AUSTRALIA'S LARGEST PERFORMING ARTS EVENT FOR SCHOOLS

<u>Disability Inclusion Survey (family survey)</u>

<u>Disability Inclusion</u> is increasing support for students with disability to ensure every student at every ability thrives at school and in life. Disability Inclusion is being rolled out to all Victorian government schools between 2021-2025, delivering:

- 1. A new strengths-based Disability Inclusion Profile
- 2. A tiered school funding model

Increased workforce capability to provide inclusive education

The Department have engaged Deloitte Access Economics to undertake an independent evaluation of Disability Inclusion.

As part of this evaluation, Deloitte is conducting a short online survey (no more than 15 minutes) of families in Victorian government schools implementing Disability Inclusion.

The survey aims to capture family awareness and understanding of Disability Inclusion, any adjustments made at a student-level and attitudes towards inclusion of students with disability more generally.

As part of this evaluation, Deloitte is surveying all families with children enrolled in Victorian government schools. This includes families who have children with disabilities and those who do not.

Parents/carers...

Monash Health South East Public Health and the Gippsland Region Public Health Units have been notified of several outbreaks of whooping cough (pertussis) in schools in their local areas.

Primary schools must not allow a child with whooping cough to attend the school for 21 days after the onset of cough or until they have completed 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment.

Contacts aged younger than 7 years who are in the same classroom as a confirmed whooping cough case, and who have not received 3 doses of pertussis vaccine, should also be excluded for 14 days from after they were last exposed to a person diagnosed with whooping cough, or until they have completed 5 days of a course of antibiotic treatment.

We encourage all students to stay home if sick, practice good hand hygiene, cover their cough and dispose of tissues in a bin.







Declan's Workshop Overview

This workshop is designed to help students navigate the digital world by understanding that while the internet offers great opportunities, it's also a space where they need to be mindful of their actions. The focus is on encouraging students to make smart, positive choices to ensure their safety both online and offline.

In this session, students will explore:

- The difference between banter and bullying
- How to present their best selves online
- The importance of knowing where to seek help

How to report any issues or concerns they encounter

VAPES ...

Parents please have a discussion with your children re: using vapes

Vapes are battery operated devices that heat liquid (often called e-liquid). It produces an aerosol which is inhaled by the user, mimicking the act of smoking. This is often referred to as vaping.

Some vapes contain nicotine, while others are nicotine free. At this stage, due to limited regulation, it is difficult to determine how much nicotine a vaping product may contain. Nicotine is the same highly addictive substance found in traditional tobacco products.

Vaping products have been marketed in a range of different shapes and sizes and sometimes replicate items such as pens or highlighters which make them difficult to identify. It is illegal for children under 18 to possess or use vapes.

Please alert your children to the dangers of using vapes to ensure their safety as they grow.



If there is a school age student at your home and you don't have an nbn connection, you could qualify for free home internet until the end of 2025.

- They'll ask you some questions to see if this offer is right for you.
- If you qualify, you'll get a voucher.
- Use the voucher to connect through your chosen participating internet provider before 31 December 2024.
