School Saving Bonus-One off \$400 Assistance

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024. The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by Friday 18 October 2024:

Complete enrolment

If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about Enrolling in School.

Check your contact information

Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include: camps, trips, excursions and incursions, swimming and sporting programs, outdoor education programs, graduations, school uniforms, textbooks.

The bonus can be used at your school's approved textbook or uniform suppliers either in-store or online, or through State Schools' Relief. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities. Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Hallam PS 2025 Prep Enrolments

Prep enrolments for 2025 are almost at capacity for Hallam PS. To be eligible for Prep at Hallam PS in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025.

What you need to do:

- Use <u>Find My School</u> to locate your designated neighbour-hood school (referred to as your local school).
- Contact Hallam PS to book a school tour or to learn more about the school and the enrolment application process.
- Request an Application/Enrolment form from the school.
- Submit your Application/Enrolment for Foundation (Prep) as soon as possible before Term 4.
- Hallam PS information and transition sessions are scheduled for Term 4, 2024.
- NOTE: Students will start Foundation (Prep) at Hallam PS on Thursday 30 January 2025.

School Saving Bonus

Information for government school parents and carers

About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life that little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus.

This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

The School Saving Bonus is in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) and the Affordable School Uniforms Program.

The School Saving Bonus will be provided to schools and families in Term 4, 2024.

Who receives the School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

Actions for parents and carers

Parents and carers of children who meet the School Saving Bonus eligibility above are required to do the following by **Friday 18 October 2024**:

• Complete enrolment

If your child, or children are changing government school for Term 1 2025, or starting Prep or Year 7 in 2025, please complete enrolment. For more information, read about <u>Enrolling in School</u>.

Check your contact information

Ensure your contact information is up to date with your school. You can check this information by contacting your school directly.

Accessing the \$400 School Saving Bonus

You do not need to apply for the School Saving Bonus.

The Department of Education will email you in November 2024 with your \$400 School Saving Bonus. You will be able to access it via an online system.

You can decide how to best use the School Saving Bonus for your family's needs. You can choose how to allocate the \$400 in the online system.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

camps, trips, excursions and incursions swimming and sporting programs outdoor education programs graduations school uniforms textbooks.

The bonus can be used at your school's approved textbook or uniform suppliers either in-store or online, or through State Schools' Relief. The list of suppliers may include a school uniform or bookshop. Any amount that you choose to allocate to textbooks and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities.

Funds will roll over for use in future years if it is not all spent in 2025.

Families with more than one eligible child

Families who have more than one child at the same school can combine their School Saving Bonus payments to use on one child, or for a specific activity. So, for example, a family with 3 children who are all government school students would receive support to the value of \$1,200 and choose how they spend those funds. The School Saving Bonus cannot be combined across different schools.

Food:

- O Baby food, napples and formula

- O Spreads e.g. Jam, Vegemite
- O Long life milk
- O Tea, coffee, Milo and sugar
- O Stir fry sauces and soy sauce
- O Long life coconut milk and coconut cream

A guide to reporting cyberbullying

Whether you're dealing with harassment yourself or helping someone else, understanding the steps to report cyberbullying can make a significant difference in resolving the issue and ensuring a safer online space. This guide walks you through the essential steps to take when facing cyberbullying.

Step 1: Document the incident

Collect evidence: Before taking any action, it's essential to document the bullying thoroughly. Capture screenshots of abusive messages, comments, or posts, and save any relevant emails or direct messages. Make a note of the dates, times, and details of each incident. This evidence will be crucial when reporting the issue to platforms or authorities.

Preserve privacy: Ensure that you save all evidence securely and avoid sharing it publicly. Keeping this information confidential helps maintain privacy and supports the integrity of your report.

*Important note: DO NOT capture or share screenshots or photos of illegal or restricted content, especially if it involves explicit images of people under 18. Creating, possessing, or distributing such material can result in serious legal consequences, including charges related to child pornography. Given the strict nature of state laws on this issue, it's crucial to seek legal advice if necessary.

If you encounter child sexual exploitation material online, report it to eSafety through their online reporting form.

Step 2: Report to the social media platform

Use built-in reporting tools: Most social media platforms have built-in tools to report abuse or harassment. These tools typically allow you to report individual posts, messages, or profiles directly. Look for options like "Report," "Flag," or "Block" on the platform.

Follow platform guidelines: Each platform has specific guidelines for reporting cyberbullying. Familiarise yourself with these guidelines to ensure your report is handled appropriately. For example, platforms like Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter have dedicated support pages that outline their reporting procedures.

Provide detailed information: When making a report, be as detailed as possible. Include screenshots and a description of the harassment. This helps the platform's moderation team understand the context and take appropriate action.

Step 3: Inform the eSafety Commissioner

Contact the eSafety Commissioner: If the bullying persists or if the social media platform's response is inadequate, you can file a report to the Australian eSafety Commissioner. This is a government body dedicated to online safety which has the ability to remove the harmful content used to bully you.

Submit a report: Visit the eSafety Commissioner's website at esafety.gov.au and use their online reporting form. Provide all the relevant evidence and details about the cyberbullying. The eSafety Commissioner will review your complaint within two business days, and take down the content or offer guidance on further steps.

Access resources: The eSafety Commissioner's website also offers resources and advice for dealing with cyberbullying, including tips on how to protect your online safety and privacy.

Step 4: Seek support

Reach out for emotional support: Cyberbullying can take a significant emotional toll. Don't hesitate to seek support from friends, family, or professional counsellors. Talking to someone you trust can help you cope with the emotional impact and provide additional guidance.

Engage support services: Apart from Dolly's Dream, there are various organisations and support services in Australia that specialise in online safety and bullying prevention. These include Kids Helpline, Lifeline, and Beyond Blue. They can offer advice, counselling, and support for victims of cyberbullying.

Step 5: Monitor and follow up

Track the situation: Keep an eye on the situation even after reporting it. Ensure that the platform or authorities are taking appropriate action. If necessary, follow up with the platform or the eSafety Commissioner to check on the progress of your report.

Update security settings: Review and adjust your privacy settings on social media and other online accounts. Strengthen your account security by changing passwords, enabling two-factor authentication, and reviewing your privacy settings to prevent further harassment.

Addressing cyberbullying can feel overwhelming, but taking the right steps can lead to effective resolution and greater online safety. By following this process, you can take meaningful action to protect yourself and others from cyberbullying.

Remember, you don't have to face this issue alone—there are resources and support available to help you navigate the process and ensure a safer online experience.
