PARENT INVITATION-PARENT FORUM

As part of the review process, parents are being invited to come into the school hall on Monday 25 March from 2:30-3:30pm to speak with members of the Review Panel. Tea and coffee will be available.

We have asked Mrs Razia Mouradi to be available to assist with translating questions and comments, as required. This will provide the Review Panel with a way of gathering parent opinion about the school in person. This information will be considered as a component of the review process.

REVIEW UPDATE

Validation Day-Tuesday 3 March 2024

The Review Panel, comprising an independent Reviewer, Senior Education Improvement Leader, Challenge Partners (two Principals from local schools) and members of the Hallam PS Leadership Team, discussed the purpose of the review, roles, responsibilities and the context of the school. Hallam PS's performance data was reviewed and discussed, and the Review Panel members walked through the learning spaces to see teachers and students at work. Wellbeing and learning challenges in relation to achieving goals and targets were discussed. Members of the panel met with students to discuss their experiences of teaching and learning at Hallam PS.

At the end of these research activities and discussions, two Terms of Reference (ToR) were developed as the basis for the Fieldwork Day.

Fieldwork Day-Monday 25 March

The Terms of Reference (ToR) for the Fieldwork Day will inquire into teachers' knowledge and understanding about their students and how this informs the planning for teaching and learning, as well as how students at Hallam PS are supported to thrive. There will be a more comprehensive inquiry into all

aspects of the wellbeing, teaching and learning programs and practices at Hallam PS, as well as seeking feedback from students, parents and staff.

The Final (Panel) Day is Tuesday 26 March. A review report, based on all the information gleaned during the Review process, will be developed and provided to School Council next term. Improvement goals and targets, developed on the Final Day, will underpin the school's new 2024-2027 School Strategic Plan (SSP) and 2024 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP)



Aussie Wildlife Incursion










Payments for the Aussie Wildlife Incursion are due by TOMORROW Friday the 22nd of March.




This incursion can be paid with CSEF if eligible.



PEDESTRIAN OPERATED SIGNALS

Removal of Supervisors

The City of Casey regularly reviews its school crossing service to identify improvement opportunities to benefit Casey's growing community and Council staff. While the crossings are operated by Council, the rules around how they operate are set by the *Road Safety Act (1986)* and apply to all crossings across the State.

Under the State Government's School Crossing Subsidy Program, and to meet the VicRoads standards for the management of a school crossing supervisor at pedestrian operated signals, it must cross more than 20 primary school children both morning and afternoon to qualify as a designated crossing site.

On major roads where working traffic lights already exist, the *Road Safety Act (1986)* lends no authority for School Crossing Supervisors to stop or direct traffic. Research shows that at these sites, pedestrian operated signals provide the highest level of safety for pedestrians when used correctly.

Following recent pedestrian counts at pedestrian operated signals located on Clyde Road, Princes Highway and O'Shea Road all in Berwick as well as Frawley Road in Hallam, these locations do not qualify for a School Crossing Supervisor. School Crossings Supervisors will no longer operate at these locations from the beginning of term 2, 2024.

While there will no longer be a Crossing Supervisor at the site, we encourage the community to use the existing pedestrian lights as the safest point to cross the road in that location. To assist students and the school community through this change, we encourage you to view and share the VicRoads educational video on the importance of using pedestrian operated signals correctly. Please share this information, the video and attached flyer with your school community to ensure anyone that uses these pedestrian operated signals are aware of the removal of school crossing supervisors and how to cross the road safely.

The City of Casey will continue to advocate to the State Government for reduced speed zones, better pedestrian sequencing (time allowed for pedestrians to cross an intersection) as well as red and speed light cameras where there are large numbers of school student pedestrians.

DEVELOPMENTAL MILESTONES

By the age of 5, children can usually...

- Follow three part instructions (e.g., put on your shoes, get your backpack and line up outside).
- Understand time related words (e.g., 'before', 'after', 'now' and 'later')
- Begin to recognise some letters. sounds and numbers.
- Use well formed sentences to be understood by most people
- Take turns in conversations
- Tell simple, short stories with beginning, middle and end
- Use past and future verbs correctly. (e.g. 'went', 'will go')
- Use most speech sounds, but still may have difficulties with 's', 'r', 'l' and 'th'



SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD AT HOME

You can support your child's development at home by

- Talking to your child about experiences.
- Naming things within your environment
- Talking about the names of objects and how they're used
- Listening/reading to stories and nursery rhymes
- Encouraging play
- Encouraging the use of full sentences.
- Modelling the correct production of sounds



GET ACTIVE KIDS IS excited to announce that **Round 7 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program** is now open!

In this round, applications for a voucher or a reimbursement will close when the allocation has been exhausted. Vouchers expire 30 April 2024 so members of your community can use their voucher for a summer sport, winter sport or term-based activity.

IMPORTANT DATES

Round 7 opens for applications for a voucher or reimbursement: 10:00 am Tuesday 10 October 2023 until allocation exhausted

Reimbursement expenditure dates: from 8 May 2023 until allocation is exhausted

Vouchers expiry date: Tuesday 30 April 2024

Portal open for Activity Providers to redeem vouchers: Tuesday 10 October 2023 to Tuesday 21 May 2024.

Eligible families can apply for \$200 vouchers and use them at a registered Get Active Kids Voucher Activity Provider without having to worry about upfront costs.

The vouchers can help pay for sporting equipment, uniforms and memberships in a range of activities from club cricket to dance. There's also an opportunity to enrol toddlers in a range of activities including important learn to swim classes.

To be eligible, kids need to be aged 0 to 18 years, a Victorian resident, named on a valid Commonwealth Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card and on a valid Medicare Card at the time of application.

A special consideration stream is also available to support children residing in Victorian Care Services, temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants and international students up to 18 years at the time of application.
