#### **Half Day 2025 Prep Transition Program**

#### Fri 29 November 9am-1pm

A reminder that the final transition event for 2025 Prep students will be tomorrow morning between 9:00am and 1:00pm. Parents should already have all the necessary information. Please ensure that your child arrives at Hallam PS from 8:45am with everything they are required to bring with them. The program commences punctually at 9:00am

#### Hallam PS 2025 Enrolments

We are still receiving 2025 Prep enrolment enquiries. If you have not yet enrolled your child, please do so urgently. Unfortunately, there are no transition activities beyond tomorrow.

NOTE: Hallam PS information and transition sessions for enrolled students conclude on 29.11.2024 with the half day for 2025 Prep students from 9:00am to 1:00pm.

To be eligible for Prep at Hallam PS in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025.

Students who live within the Hallam PS enrolment zone are entitled to a place at the school. Students beyond the Hallam PS enrolment zone are able to complete an enrolment application but are not guaranteed a place unless there is capacity at their year level for 2025.

Thank you to those parents who have submitted transfer notifications for their children for the 2025 school year. This is very helpful when I am planning classes and staffing for next year. At this stage, indications are that Hallam PS will have a slightly larger enrolment next year.

If your child/ren will not be at Hallam PS in 2025, please complete the notification below and return it to the Administration Office, or contact the school on 9703 1536 as soon as possible.

# Tips for helping your children to be safe in activities without you

As your child gets a bit older, they become increasingly independent and may spend time away from you at school, sports or other activities. It is important to have conversations about staying safe when you are not there.

#### **Top Tips**

- **Set boundaries** about places they may go, people they may see, and things they may do.
- **Reinforce the importance of a buddy system** staying with a group or friend is always better than being alone.
- It's always okay to say 'NO' if they think what they're being asked to do is or feels wrong.
- Make sure they know It is always okay to ask you, a teacher or a trusted adult for help if they have any problems or if someone is making them feel unsafe or upset.
- Make sure they know **how to contact you**, or another carer if there is a problem.
- Let them know that you would never send a stranger to pick them up without letting them or the school, coach, teacher know.

#### Instagram introduces teen accounts

Instagram has introduced new rules for teenagers meaning children under 17 now automatically have their accounts set to private and can't be messaged or tagged by people they don't follow.

Some of the other changes include:

- parents and carers can set daily time limits on Instagram use
- teens get notified to leave the app after 60 minutes each day
- parents and carers can see the accounts their children message and the content categories they view
- hidden words settings automatically hide unwanted comments and messages

The new Teen Accounts are a step in the right direction, but they still put the onus on parents and carers to understand <u>parental supervision settings</u>. Share <u>The eSafety Guide</u> with your school community, which shares how to protect personal information and report harmful content on common social media, games, apps and sites, including <u>Instagram</u>.
