Future New Buildings for Hallam PS

Leadership are currently in discussion with the VSBA and AOA (an architect firm) about some future building projects planned for HPS. AOA intend to come to our next School Council meeting to consult about ideas and designs with its members. There are some exciting ideas considered, and once funding has been confirmed, plans will be shared with the HPS community.

LAAK Early Learning Victoria

Laak ELV is open for business, with a beautiful new sign on their building. Staff are on site preparing for the 2026 kinder year. We look forward to liaising and sharing some events with Laak over the year. The existing kinder next door will be demolished in January to make way for our new oval. Laak ELV sits on our previous play space/oval.

Temporary fencing will be placed to ensure the safety of our students during the demolition.

Permanent high cyclone fencing will be installed on the Harmer Road side of the oval once the oval is graded, seeded and established. Goal posts for both AFL and soccer, will be placed for our students' enjoyment.

Staffing for 2026


There will be several staff changes next year. HPS







Changes to digital device use

From 2027, the Victorian Government is introducing changes to the use of digital devices for students from Prep to Grade 6.

Under the new guidelines, schools:

- will no longer invite families to purchase or bring their own digital devices to use at school for Prep to Grade 6
- will follow new recommended digital device times, including minimal device time for Prep to Grade 2; and a maximum of 90 minutes per day for grades 3 to 6.

These changes are intended to support families by reducing cost-of-living pressures. They will also support students by reducing screen-time which can reduce the risk of eye strain, sedentary behaviour, and reduced peer interaction. These reforms complement Victoria's nation-leading mobile phone restrictions, ensuring an integrated approach to addressing digital distraction and the inappropriate use of technology.

What this means for our school

As you know, we already provide school-owned digital devices for student learning, so there is no impact on our school's computer programs.

Students with disability who use a digital device as a reasonable adjustment are exempt from these changes.

These changes are intended to support families with cost-of-living pressures and reduce student screen time.



Power Saving Bonus Program

The Power Saving Bonus is a \$100 payment providing real help to address the cost of living and drive down energy bills for Victorians in need. Victorian households with an eligible concession card can visit the Victorian Energy Compare website - compare.energy.vic.gov.au - to apply online or apply through the Community Outreach Program.

Eligibility criteria

To be eligible, households will need to:

- · Have a recent residential electricity bill
- Hold one of the following concession cards:
 - Health Care Card
 - Pensioner Concession Card
 - Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card
 - Veterans' Affairs Gold Card
- · Only one payment per household is available.



Applications open on 25 August 2025 and can be submitted on this website, over the phone, or through a participating community organisation.
